FAQ's

How many schools will be participating in the RENGEN Project:

We are able to accommodate 4-5 schools and around 6-15 students per school.

How many sessions will there be in the whole program?

For the online sessions we will be working with 25 -30 students at a time; however, for in person sessions, we will work with 10 -12 to make it a safe and engaging practical experience.

In total, each student will engage in 2 online sessions and 3 practical sessions.

How often will the sessions happen?

Sessions will occur weekly and student engagement with the material is expected. Online sessions can be up to 2 hours while practical sessions may take upto 4 hours. Depending on your school's session allocation, practical sessions may be every 2 weeks.

What platform will be used for the sessions?

Zoom is the intended platform for the sessions as participants find it easy to join the meeting.

How many months/ weeks will the whole program take?

This depends on the number of students, but we expect it to take 5 weeks to finish the program per school. This will likely occur in two blocks of 3 schools participating.

Please note that if schools wish to use this as a GAIA project, the duration of the overall project will be longer depending on the type of Project each school pursues.
